

How to clean your Cellular Blinds

Cellular blinds are the new kid on the block when it comes to window furnishings, and they're the trendy new must-have for your home. The innovative, hollow cell design makes them excellent insulators, but it's also an excellent place for dust to collect. So how do you keep your Cellular blinds clean? What you need

- A vacuum with a brush and a hose attachment
- A microfiber cloth
- Warm soapy water
- Can of compressed air

Easy Cleaning Tips

Keeping Cellular blinds clean isn't a big task, but there are a few important things you should keep in mind to help prevent any damage to your new blinds.

- To remove surface level dust and dirt, gently sweep across the fabric with the brush attachment of your vacuum.
- Use the low suction setting on your vacuum if you have one
- Do not vacuum without the brush attachment as it may crumple and deform the fabric of your cellular blinds.
- Blow any debris out from inside the fabric cells with a can of compressed air or the hose attachment of your vacuum. If you have neither on hand, try using a hairdryer on a cold setting.
- Fabric should not be cleaned with water
- Finger marks and spots can be cleaned by wiping with a damp cloth.
- To remove stains, you can spot clean with a micro fiber cloth and warm soapy water. Dab the stain to remove.
- Do not scrub as this may cause the fabric to pill.
- For more stubborn stains, a specialist fabric stain remover might be required to be applied.
- Use a clean microfiber cloth to completely dry the stain and prevent water rings or water lines.

Preparing your Cellular Blinds

- Pull the cord down to lower your cellular blinds

Operating your Cellular Blind

- Pull the draw cord up or down to raise or lower the cellular blind
- Angle the cord to the side of the blind and release to lock it at the desired height
- Pull down towards the centre of the blind to release the cords to lift or lower the blind

Cleaning your Cellular Blinds

Follow our simple cleaning instructions below to keep your Cellular blinds looking stylish. Regular weekly cleans will prevent your cellular blinds from losing their shape or succumbing to grime, mould and dirt.

1. Vacuum your blinds to remove any dust or dirt build up – don't forget to ensure that the back is supported and that you vacuum in a sweeping motion across your blinds.
2. Turn your blinds around and vacuum the opposite side
3. Remove any finger marks or stains with some warm water and a damp microfiber cloth
4. Vacuum any dust or dirt that might have fallen onto your window sill
5. If your blinds have been left for a long time without cleaning or maintenance and are too dirty to be cleaned with a vacuum and cloth, you may need to take them into a professional drycleaner

General tips

- Leave the cellular blind fully drawn up for several hours per week. This keeps the pleats trained so they won't sag.

So there you have it! Smart design make your Cellular blinds the new 'It' thing in window fashion, but it doesn't mean you'll spend more time cleaning! Like most blinds, your Cellular blinds just need a bit of regular TLC.
